"I spent much of April, 1968, doing advance work for Senator Eugene McCarthy's presidential campaign in the Indiana primary.

As I recall (very possibly wrongly), Indiana had a conservative Democratic governor who strongly preferred Senator Hubert Humphrey. In addition, Senator Kennedy had just jumped into the race, so the Indiana primary was heavy going. I don't even remember who won.

What I do remember is a benefit concert in a Purdue University auditorium put on by a duo of whom I had never heard until that evening, Simon and Garfunkel. They played a number of their signature songs, including 'Scarborough Fair,' 'Parsley Sage,' 'Bridge over Troubled Water,' and 'Sound of Silence.'

If I remembered a few of my classes nearly as clearly as I remember that evening, I suppose that I might have become a lawyer."
