

Receiving a Rhodes, so long ago

Brownlee, Echols, Gubser, Portes Receive 1962 Rhodes Scholarships

Four Yale students have been named winners of 1962 Rhodes scholarships.

David A. Brownlee, Louis S. Echols, Nicholas James Gubser, and Richard David Portes, all of whom will graduate from Yale College this spring, were among 32 United States students to receive the scholarships awards for study at Oxford. The award winners were announced December 18 at Swarthmore College.

The scholars-elect were selected by Rhodes scholarship committees in eight US districts. They represent 26 states and 20 colleges and universities. Harvard placed eight men among the recipients while Princeton placed three.

Stipends of \$2,100 per year are granted the students for two years of study at the English university. They may enter any field in which Oxford offers a degree. Upon the decision of the Rhodes trustees, the scholarships may be extended for a third year of study.

Yale Winners

David Anderson Brownlee is a history honors major and has been a ranking scholar for one term and has won scholarship honors throughout his career at Yale. He is a native of Pittsburgh, Pa., and prepared for Yale at Mount Lebanon High School. The senior from Branford College is
